Introduction

After a fantastic year of seeing the return of our volunteer programme in 2022, 2023 saw one of our biggest programmes to date, with groups travelling to Ghana, Kenya and Zanzibar to pick up the baton and continue with the development work at our partner schools.

There have been some real standout successes this year, and I am delighted to share our 2023 Impact Report, which showcases the remarkable achievements throughout the year, made possible with the dedicated support of our volunteers.

This year, our partner schools in Kenya welcomed Derby County Community Trust (DCCT) to celebrate 10 years of partnership and life-changing trips. Starting out as a group of 13 volunteers in 2013 and now fast forward 10 years, 500 people have travelled with DCCT, contributing to the construction of classrooms, toilet blocks and kitchens at our partner schools as well as raising tens of thousands of pounds for our partner schools and the local Derby community.

2023 has marked the completion of our WASH (Water, Sanitation and Hygiene) programme in Zanzibar, with the final construction work finished at Kinuni School, with support from The High School of Glasgow. Their students raised the money to fund the new toilet block and supported with the construction of it during their trip.

Before the project, there were just four 'working' latrine toilets between all three schools. Now completed, the programme has delivered 37 new gendered latrine toilets, 12 handwashing stations, and a transformational menstrual health management programme, impacting over 15,000 students.

Thank you to everyone who has helped bring our work to life in 2023, making a real impact at our partner schools that will continue to make a difference to the lives of children in years to come.

"This year, we completed the WASH Programme, finishing the final construction work at Kinuni School. The project has delivered 37 new gendered latrine toilets, 12 handwashing stations, and a transformational menstrual health management programme for 15,000 students. It has been fantastic to see the confidence of our female students grow, with some nominating themselves as menstrual Health Management mentors, encouraging younger students to approach them when they start their period so that they can provide support and ensure access to reusable sanitary pads through the programme. African Adventures Foundation 2023 Impact

"What a year it has been for the Foundation! 2023 marked our biggest fundraiser to date, the Isle of Wight Ultra Challenge, where African Adventures' staff and our supporters walked either 25km, 50km or 106km around the island over one or two days to raise £12,500 for our food security programmes. We also saw the completion of our WASH programme in Zanzibar, and our Good Period programme in Kenya increased its support from providing 90 girls with sanitary pads each month to manage their menstruation to 200 girls. Thank you so much to everyone for their support this year; without you and your kind donations, we wouldn't have achieved what we did at our partner schools."
